A Trusted International Coalition Driving Private Investment for Nature

The Organization for Biodiversity Certificates (OBC) is an association of over 30 international members (including companies and organizations such as Bouygues, Pernod Ricard, Kering, Ardian, Agromap, Fronterra, Le Printemps des Terres, Biota, Fransylva, ATIBT, aDryada, AETS, etc.) to deploy practice-based biodiversity certificates that significantly increase private investment for nature protection and restoration worldwide. These biodiversity certificates are scientifically grounded, easy to understand, and easy to report.

The OBC is part of major international initiatives, such as the International Advisory Panel on Biodiversity Credits (IAPB) and the Biodiversity Credit Alliance (BCA), and partner with recognized scientific institutions.

To create the biodiversity certificates, OBC is deploying pilot projects in order to adapt these biodiversity certificates to the countries' ecosystem and actual field conditions. The methodology is currently being optimized through national pilots in various countries (France, Côte d'Ivoire, Peru, Cameroon, Denmark, Germany, Rwanda, etc.) covering both forest and agricultural ecosystems. From these pilots, we plan to launch the first biodiversity certificates by 2027, attracting large-scale private investment in nature across participating countries.
